After college, he joined the United States Marine Corps. In the Marine Corps, he served his country as a CH46 helicopter pilot for 21 years. He went on to receive a Master's Degree in Education from the University of West Florida.

He was a fantastic father and grandfather. He impacted the lives of many who knew him and he is deeply missed.
